

Ayr Belleisle Golf Club - Club Championship 2017 – Competition Conditions

Archibald Walker Trophy

Qualifiers for the Archibald Walker Trophy shall be the 18 competitors who return the lowest 36 hole total gross scores determined from 2 of 3 qualifying competitions and who are available to play in the final 36 hole event that will determine the eventual winner.

The 18 competitors who qualify for the Archibald Walker Trophy are eligible only to compete in that competition. They will not be eligible to participate in the corresponding Daldorch Trophy competition.

The Archibald Walker Trophy competition shall comprise 36 holes stroke play taking place over 2 days. All competitors shall compete over 18 holes on the first day, after which only the 9 (and ties) competitors who have returned the lowest Gross score shall progress. These 9 (and ties) competitors shall compete over a further 18 holes on the second day. The winner of the championship shall be the competitor who returns the lowest total gross score for 36 holes over the two days.

In the event of a tie after 36 holes, the competition shall be decided on the best second round gross score. If still tied then the best back nine holes, back six holes, back 3 holes process shall be invoked. If still tied then the competition committee will decide on how the competition winner shall be decided.

Following the published draw for the final 36 hole stroke play, any competitor who withdraws or scratches at any time before or during that section of the competition will not be replaced by a substitute, and the competition will progress with the remaining competitors.

Responsibility for the running of the competition shall rest with the ABGC committee to whom all disputes will be referred and whose decisions will be final

Competitors are required to register with the competition starter (committee member) a minimum of 15 mins prior to their allocated tee time. Failure to do so may result in loss of hole penalty and / or disqualification.

Club Championship – Daldorch Trophy

Qualifiers for the Daldorch Trophy will be subject to identical conditions as for the Archibald Walker Trophy, (above), with the only exceptions being that :-

The competitors shall be the 18 competitors who return the lowest 36 hole total nett scores determined from 2 of 3 qualifying competitions, who have not already qualified for the Archibald Walker Trophy, and who are available to play in the final 36 hole event that will determine the eventual winner

and

All competitors shall compete over 18 holes on the first day, after which only the 9 (and ties) competitors who have returned the lowest nett score shall progress. These 9 (and ties) competitors shall compete over a further 18 holes on the second day. The winner of the championship shall be the competitor who returns the lowest total nett score for 36 holes over the two days.

In the event of a tie after 36 holes, the competition shall be decided on the best second round nett score. If still tied then the best back nine holes, back six holes, back 3 holes process shall be invoked. If still tied then the competition committee will decide on how the competition winner shall be decided.
